The 2008 Permit Extension Act was revised on December 26, 2014, and extended until June 30, 2016.

Secretary Fisher signed an executive order for a mass demolition permit of unsafe structures in Monmouth, Ocean, and Cape-Atlantic counties. Keep an eye out for large areas at a time, but no one plans over 5,000 sq ft.

Attorney, Doug Widman, is currently in litigation for the Buck Mining project in Millstone. Will keep the Board updated as necessary. Mr. Widman has also been working on access agreements with Monroe and Manalapan Townships for the Manalapan Brook Grant.

Bill Brash (Mercer SCD), Mark Alliston (FSCD), and Doug Kauffman (NRCS) had a joint inspection of the Twin Rivers housing project in East Windsor. The lake on the project extends into Middlesex County.

A. Education Committee

1. Outreach:

- *Stewardship*: The 2015 Stewardship theme is "Local Heroes: Your Hardworking Pollinators" and orders are coming in from teachers for the materials which will they will receive in April.
- Plants for Pollinators: We are in the process of selecting new schools for 2015.
- *Trout in the Classroom*: Mid-project reports are due by the end of February. Trout Release Day at the Forest Resource Education Center will take place on May 13th.

- *Scholarships*: The 2015 Scholarship applications are available on our website and a release has gone out to the newspapers.
