## Here's how it works:

**Step 2** [Search for your address](#) in the Manalapan Brook Watershed online map (blue highlighted area). If you are in the watershed you will qualify to receive free plants and a soil test kit while supplies last. Note: you must attend the April 12th workshop and be located in the watershed to qualify.

**Step 3** Pickup your plants and soil test kit. These items will be available starting in May. Pickup details to be shared during the webinar.
